Some biblical scholars say that these pictures show dwellings of families in Israel during the time of Jesus.


They say that Jesus' family and their community stayed in these kind of houses.

Late one morning, as Jesus washes the dishes, he sees his friend Andrew from their window. Andrew seems sad as he sits on the doorstep of their house.




"Andrew," Jesus shouts.
