PRELUDE

PROCESSIONAL

*CALL TO WORSHIP

Joyful music is played while people are assembled outside the church/venue in an act of meeting up with the resurrected Christ. (A band using different musical instruments are used for the entire worship.)

Processional follows with selected individuals bringing the following resurrection symbols:

•	Bible	To symbolize the written testimony of Christ' resurrection
•	Flowers	To symbolize freshness
•	Seedlings	To symbolize victory of life over death
•	Christ' Candle	To symbolize the light of Christ overcoming darkness
		(Lighted after the Call to Confession)
•	Offering plates	To symbolize readiness of people to offer life and material
		resources for the work of kin-dom building.

*INVOCATION (In unison)

God of life, we come today to happily celebrate Jesus' resurrection. Be with us once again through the Holy Spirit to help us fully understand what it means to celebrate Easter especially in this time and context. In Christ' name. Amen.

Response: They cut me down and I leapt up high

I am the life that will never, never die I'll live in you if you'll live in me I am the Lord of the dance, said he.

Chorus:

DRAMATIC READING (Coming from different directions)

- **Voice 1:** Mocked by his tormentors and abandoned by his closest friends, Jesus breathed his last with the sole assurance that he had accomplished the mission that God sent him for. It didn't matter what lay in store for him beyond his crucifixion. But God gave Jesus an answer that he didn't ask for. He bestowed on him a blessing never received by anyone before—the power of resurrection from the dead!
- **Voice 2:** God didn't just rescue him from the world of the dead which was the destination of every mortal being. God granted him the power of resurrection that no one else has but the almighty and eternal God. Sharing this power with God, Jesus has received the authority to share it also with those who believe and follow him. God has more than answered Jesus'

question about his fate. God made Jesus' resurrection the end goal of every believer who followed him and carried their crosses for his sake.

Voice 3: There is another side to God's answer to Jesus. God affirmed and vindicated his chosen path of obedience. Jesus took up the cause of those who have suffered abuse, violence, neglect, humiliation and oppression by society's powers-that-be. Instead of being decorated he was despised, persecuted, criminalized and made to suffer. By his resurrection, God upheld his choice to be with the world's sufferers. Although Jesus failed to change the world in his life on earth, God endorsed his pursuit of truth and justice as the right path towards the establishment of his kin-dom on earth. Jesus' resurrection is the ultimate proof of God's approval of his work in the world.
