LESSON 25: WE ARE ENTRUSTED WITH GOD'S CREATION

General Concept: We are created to be faithful and responsible stewards of God's creation, enabling us to respect and preserve its integrity.

Biblical References: Genesis 1:28-30; Isaiah 65:17-25

List of Lectionary Readings for the Week: Ruth 3:1-5; 4:13-17; Psalm 127; 1 Kings 17:8-16; Psalm 146; Hebrews 9:24-28; Mark 12:38-44

Age-Level Concepts

- The earth is our only home.
- The fruits of the land sustain us and give us life.
- God mandates people to take care of creation and uphold its integrity.

Learning Objectives

At the end of the session, the learners are expected to:

- Explain that the earth is our only home and the fruits of the land sustain us and give us life
- Give reasons why God mandates us to take care of creation and uphold its integrity
- Resolve to participate in caring for the environment

Materials: The Holy Bible (preferably the New Revised Standard Version [NRSV]), song chart, offering plate or basket, notebook/journal, pens, paper

Suggested Lesson Outline

Greeting Time

Announcements and/or Birthday Greetings

Opening Prayer (Also pray for the birthday celebrant[s], if there are any.)

Our God in heaven and on earth, today we pray for your presence to be with us as we study about our only home, the world you created. Open our eyes and ears so that your message may be implanted in our hearts. In Jesus' name we pray. Amen.

Opening Song "For the Beauty of the Earth" (Hymnal of a Faith Journey, p. 233)

For the beauty of the earth, for the splendor of the skies,

For the love which from our birth over and around us lies,

Refrain:

God of all, to you we raise this our hymn of grateful praise.

For the wonder of each hour of the day and of the night, Hill and vale, and tree and flow'r, sun and moon, and stars of light, (Refrain)

For the joy of human love, brother, sister, parent, child, Friends on earth and friends above, for all gentle thoughts and mild, (Refrain)

Recite a portion of the UCCP Statement of Faith:

"We believe that being entrusted with God's creation...."

Getting Ready

- Brainstorm with the learners the concept of "being entrusted with God's creation".
- Let them freely share their thoughts.

Learning Time

Discovering the Biblical Truth

- Have the class read Genesis 1:28-30, the boys reading the first verse, the girls reading the second verse, and everyone reading the last verse.
- Let the class silently read Isaiah 65:17-25.
- Give them a few minutes to write down on their journals/notebooks their personal reflections on the texts using the following as guide:
 - Describe the world God made.
 - What was the main responsibility of human beings given by God based on Genesis 1:28-30?
 - How do you react whenever you read, hear or watch news about the abuse of Mother Earth, like irresponsible mining, corporate logging, destructive fishing, etc.?
 - What are the people's efforts and actions that you know of and have participated in to uphold the integrity of creation?
 - Will you be willing to get involved in the ministry of the Church that takes care of God's creation? Why or why not?
- Have volunteers share their reflections to the class.
- Further discuss the passages using the Biblical Background for these texts as guide.

Lessons Learned

Ask: What can we do to become faithful and responsible stewards of God's creation?

Applying the Lessons Learned

• Let them enumerate the ways by which they can become responsible, faithful, and respectful stewards, upholding the dignity of creation. Have them list these ways down in a table checklist. Example:



My own efforts as a responsible steward of creation	Yes	No
I will use water properly.		
I will conserve electricity.		
I will use paper wisely.		
I will walk or bike to nearby places.

Closing Worship

Offering

Closing Song (can also be read as poem) "The Rape of the Land"

LESSON 26: WE ARE CALLED TO PARTICIPATE IN THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A JUST AND COMPASSIONATE SOCIAL ORDER

General Concept: We are called to actively participate in establishing a just and compassionate social order, where the needs of everyone, especially the least of the least, are met.



Biblical Reference: Isaiah 58: 6-9; Psalm 132:13-18; Hebrews 10:24

List of Lectionary Readings for the Week: 1 Samuel 1:4-20; Psalm 16; Daniel 12:1-3; Hebrews 10:11-14, (15-18), 19-25; Mark 13:1-8

Age-Level Concepts

- God's creation is intended to provide abundant life for all.
- God's creation will benefit all humanity when generosity and compassion is observed by all.

Learning Objectives

- Assert that a just and compassionate social order is where the needs of everyone, especially the least of the least, are met
- Advocate actions and undertakings that the church need to do to build a just and compassionate social order, like education and mobilization
- Rally the people of God to be in solidarity with the least of the least in ensuring that basic needs are met

Materials: The Holy Bible (preferably the New Revised Standard Version [NRSV]), song chart, offering plate or basket, journal, pens, play money (see *Discovering the Biblical Truth*)

Suggested Lesson Outline

Greeting Time

Opening Song "It Could Be a Wonderful World" (Children Praise God, p. 187)

If each little child could have fresh milk each day If each worker just had enough time to play

If each homeless person had some place to stay

It could be a wonderful world.

If there were no poor and the rich were content If strangers were welcome wherever they went If everyone knew what community meant It could be a wonderful world.

If we could consider each other, a neighbor, friend, sister or brother It could be a wonderful, wonderful world, it could be a wonderful world.

Announcements and/or Birthday Greetings

Opening Prayer (Also pray for the birthday celebrant[s], if there are any.)

Gracious God, open our minds and hearts as we come to study and learn. May Your message for us today touch and move us to respond to your challenge. In Jesus' name we pray. Amen.

Recite a portion of the UCCP Statement of Faith:

"We believe that being entrusted with God's creation, they are called to participate in the establishment of a just and compassionate social order."



Getting Ready

Brainstorm with the learners the concept of "a just and compassionate social order".

Learning Time

Discovering the Biblical Truth

- Game: Trip to Heaven
 - o Give the participants play money. Distribute the money unequally.
 - Bring them outside the room. Instruct them that the room symbolizes heaven or the eternal reign of God.
 - They can only enter heaven if they have the following amount:
 - 2 twenty-peso bills
 - 1 fifty-peso bill
 - 3 one hundred-peso bills
 - o They cannot enter heaven if:
 - They do not have the exact amount; it has to be exact no more no less
 - Other participants do not have the same amount
 - o Reflect:
 - Was anyone able to enter heaven?
 - What did they do with their resources?
 - Did those who have more than enough share what they have?
- Read and discuss the texts:
 - Guide questions for discussion:
 - What does fast mean in the Isaiah text?
 - How are we supposed to "fast"? (verses 6-7, 9b)
 - What happens when we fast this way? (8-9a)
 - How does the Psalmist describe God's final and eternal reign?
 - In relation to the faithful
 - In relation to those who oppose God's reign

Lessons Learned

- Go back to the Trip to Heaven game:
 - Were there some participants who were like the believers written about in Hebrews?
 - Provoking one another to love and do good deeds
 - Encouraging one another
- What concrete ways of "provoking one another to love and do good deeds" have you done already? What more need to be done?
- A compassionate and just social order cannot be achieved if we do not encourage and provoke each other to do acts of love and goodness.

Applying the Lessons Learned

• List down ministries of the church that help establish a just and compassionate social order. Have each one name at least one church ministry and share their level of participation in this ministry. Example:



- Feeding program
- Information dissemination campaigns
- Educational awareness
- Direct community integration
- Organic farming
- Capability-building trainings
- Medical missions
- Relief missions
